Seven Things You Can Do

To Keep Our Neighborhood Looking Great

A well-kept neighborhood makes an impression that benefits everyone!

 Keep your grass cut regularly. Trimming and edging add a lot to the look of your home.



- 2. Retrieve your trash cans Friday afternoon or night.
- 3. Blow or sweep your grass trimmings back into your yard instead of leaving them in the street.
- 4. Trim the bushes around your house. Also, keep any plants and grass trimmed back off and out of the curb.
- 5. Check the Protective Covenants before you build, fence, or alter your property to assure compliance.
- 6. Store lawn equipment and project materials out of sight unless currently in use.
- Consider a professional lawn mowing and/or fertilization and weed-control company. Our Protective Covenants are listed on the website.
